

A unique dining experience awaits you at Mulligan's. We have created two rooms that will enhance any special occasion or add an air of dignity to any meeting.

In 1987, we opened the "Mansion Library". The room was modeled after a turn-of-the-centery mansion library and is available for group or individual reservations. The solid oak paneled room has a rich mahogany finish. The double French beveled glass entrance doors are a 19th Century Victorian design. The large carved oak fireplace mantle was salvaged from a mansion in the Buckhead District of Atlanta, Ga. The four bronze and leaded glass chandeliers come from the Hollywood set of the 1999 movie "The Haunting" starring Catherine Zeta-Jones and Owen Wilson. The Victorian style carpeting was imported from London, England as was the wall covering above the oak paneling. The high relief wall covering is called Lincrusta and was invented in London in 1877 by the inventor of Linoleum. It can be found in the most prestigious mansions in Europe and the United States, for example, the Carnegie Mansion in New York, the Pabst Mansion in Milwaukee, Wis., the Rockefeller family mansion, and now Mulligan's Mansion Library and Victorian Dining Rooms.

The twelve foot wide stained glass bay windows were created by local artisans using antique style glass imported from Germany. The oak bookcases are intricately carved and contain a wide selection of reference books for our patrons use. The rich Queen Ann tufted wing back conference chairs add a distinguished "men's club" atmosphere

to the room.

The "Victorian Dining Room" was opened in 1995. It is a bit more elegant and slightly more feminine than the Library. A quiet respite from the hustle, bustle of the Pub. It is also available for individual or group reservations.

The unique quartz surround that accents the large oak fireplace in the Victorian Dining Room was salvaged from a mantle imported from London, England and enhanced with intricate carvings from California. The Lincrusta wall covering and the Victorian style carpeting were also imported from London. The large tapestry hanging on the north wall was imported from France. The antique bronze sconces on the west wall come from a bank in Chicago, Ill. The decorative tin ceiling was hand-painted by local art students and Mulligan's employees. The hand gilding of the 185 panels took over 2 hours each to complete.

The hall chandelier, large pier mirror, and the two round Tiffany style stained glass ceiling pieces were obtained at an architectural antique auction in Atlanta, Georgia. The ceiling domes were originally the front windows of the First Baptist Church in downtown Canton that was destroyed by a fire in 1991. A signed Tiffany window, "The Danner Memorial window (1913)", from the Church, sold at the same auction, to a private collector in Japan for

\$2 Million.
