

Los Angeles Venues

Duplex on Third Opened in July, the two-story space has a residential aesthetic. Designed by Thomas Schoos, the first story has a patio that wraps around the restaurant; a cozy bar and lounge with communal tables; and a dining room clad with a fireplace and flea-market finds from around the world. A series of sliding glass doors separate the interior lounge and bar from the patio; they open to create a seamless indoor-outdoor space. Upstairs offers a bar and lounge, and an adjoining private dining room with expansive windows creates another naturally lit interior. (8722 West Third St., 310.276.6223)



Hub Los Angeles The new 4,000-square-foot Hub Los Angeles opened in September in the arts district downtown with a mission to further social enterprise, education, and collaborations across sectors. The member services include access to flexible office amenities, lounge and café space, and an outdoor social setting. (830 Traction Ave., 213.325.1271)



Sound Muse Lifestyle Group opened 8,000-square-foot Sound in October. The club includes concepts from iCrave Design such as a sunken dance floor, elevated DJ booth, real-time 3-D generative and audio reactive effects, and changeable silk display panels on the façade. 3Dog Cantina Curtis Nysmith opened 3Dog Cantina in September in Hollywood's Cahuenga Corridor. The Spacecraft-designed restaurant serves regional Mexican cuisine and specialty cocktails in a setting inspired by traditional Mexican celebrations. There's a family-style taco bar, two banquettes equipped with beer taps, an enclosed back patio dining area, and a garden on the roof that grows ingredients used in the menu. The space will be available for full buyout with a capacity of around 250. The back patio has its own entrance and holds about 40. A balcony also accommodates private events.
